

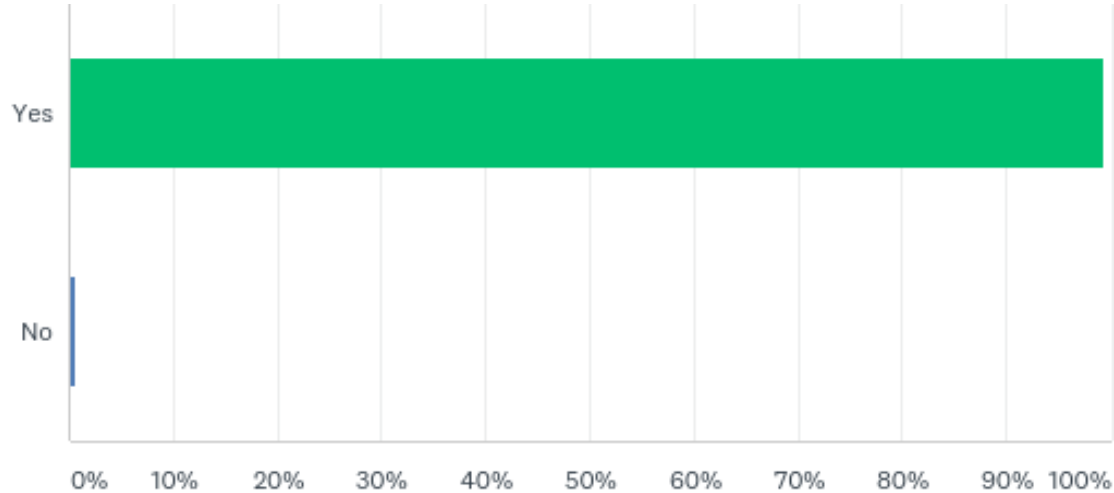

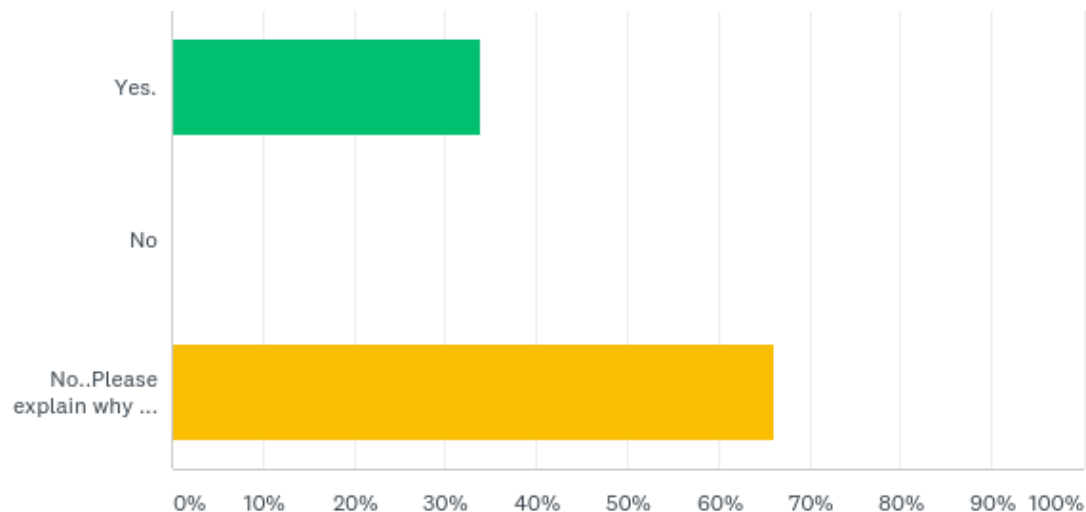

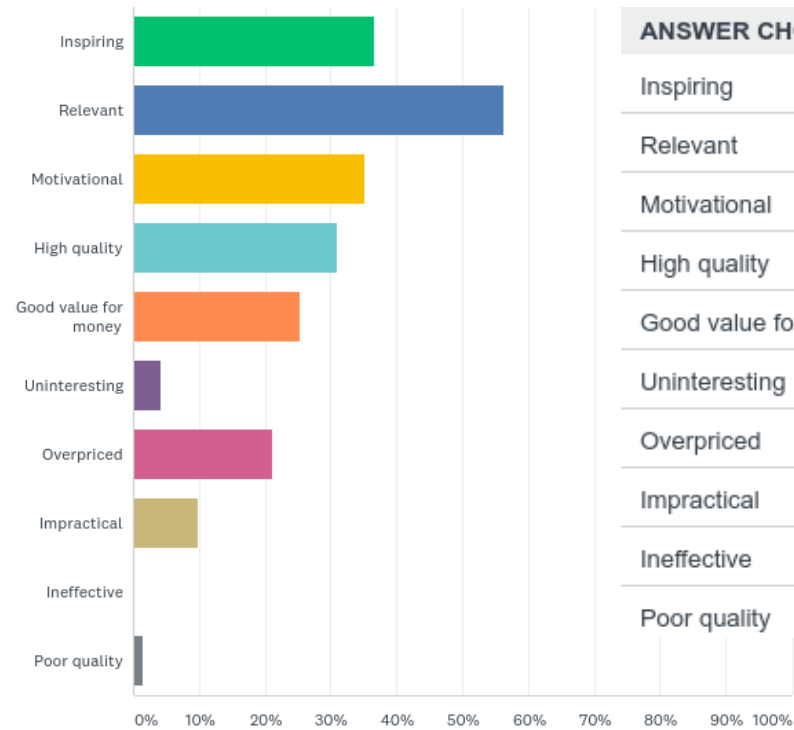

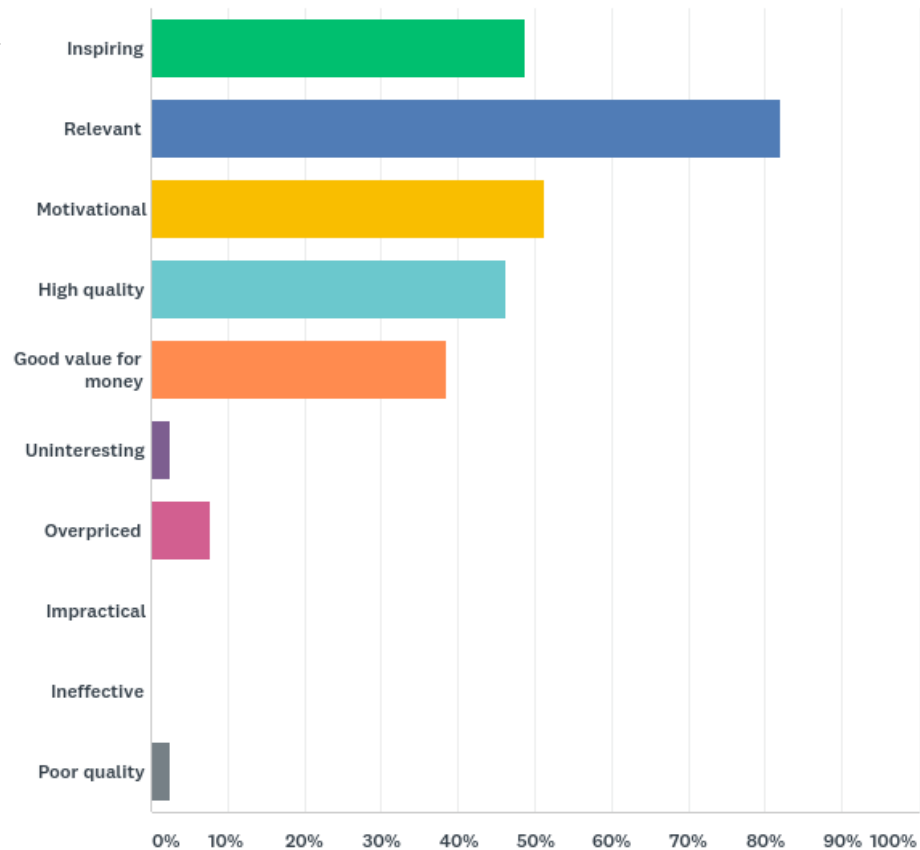

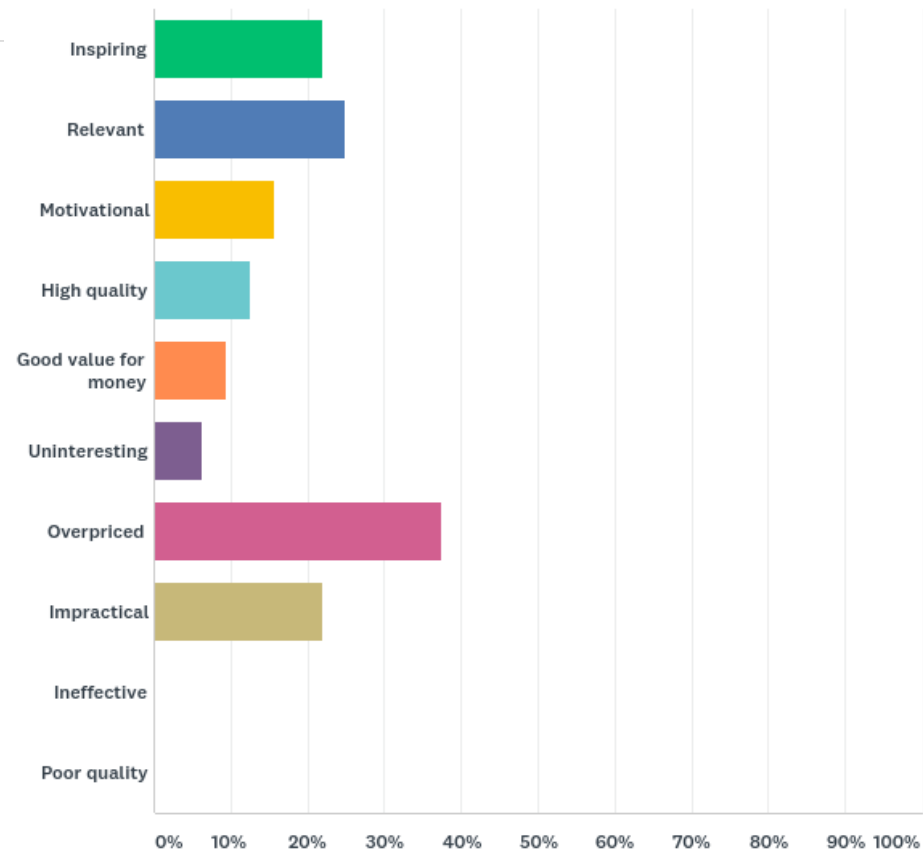

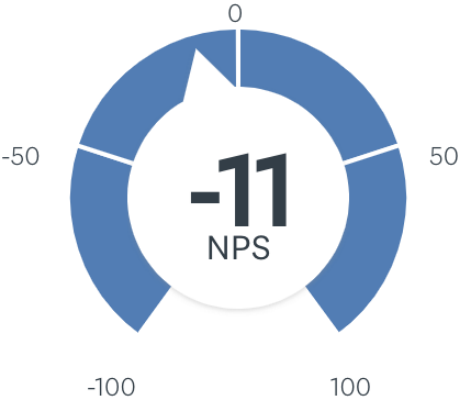


Opinion of those who did not attend



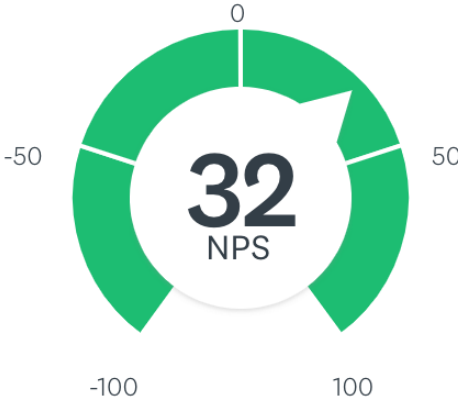
How likely is it that you would recommend attending a BATOD conference?

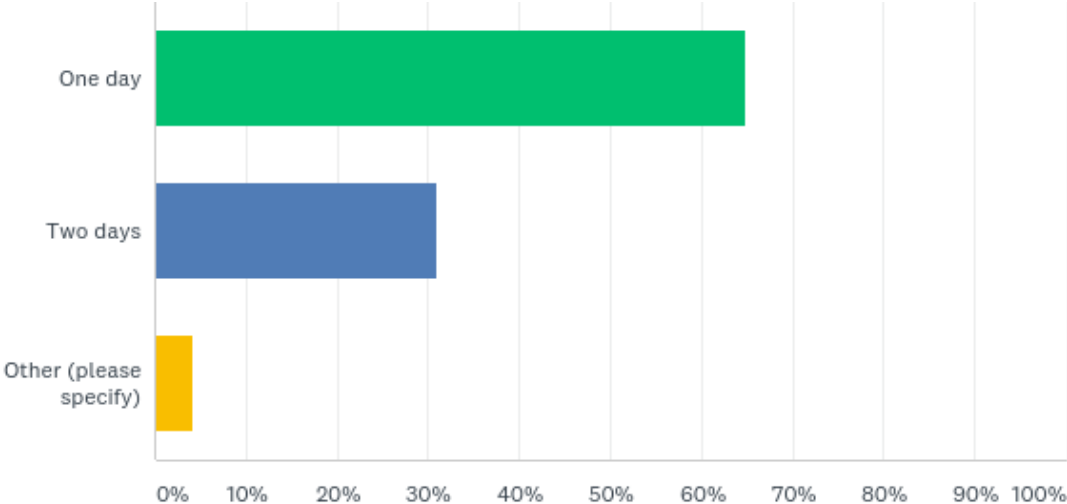

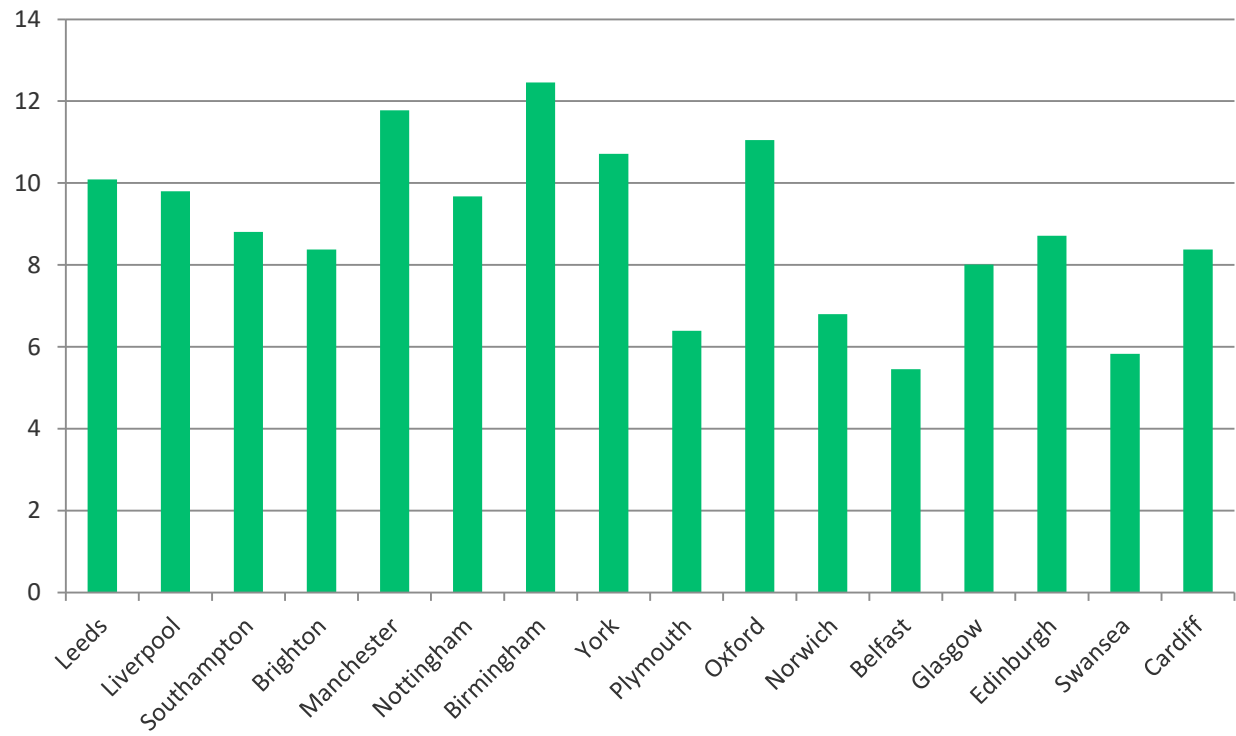

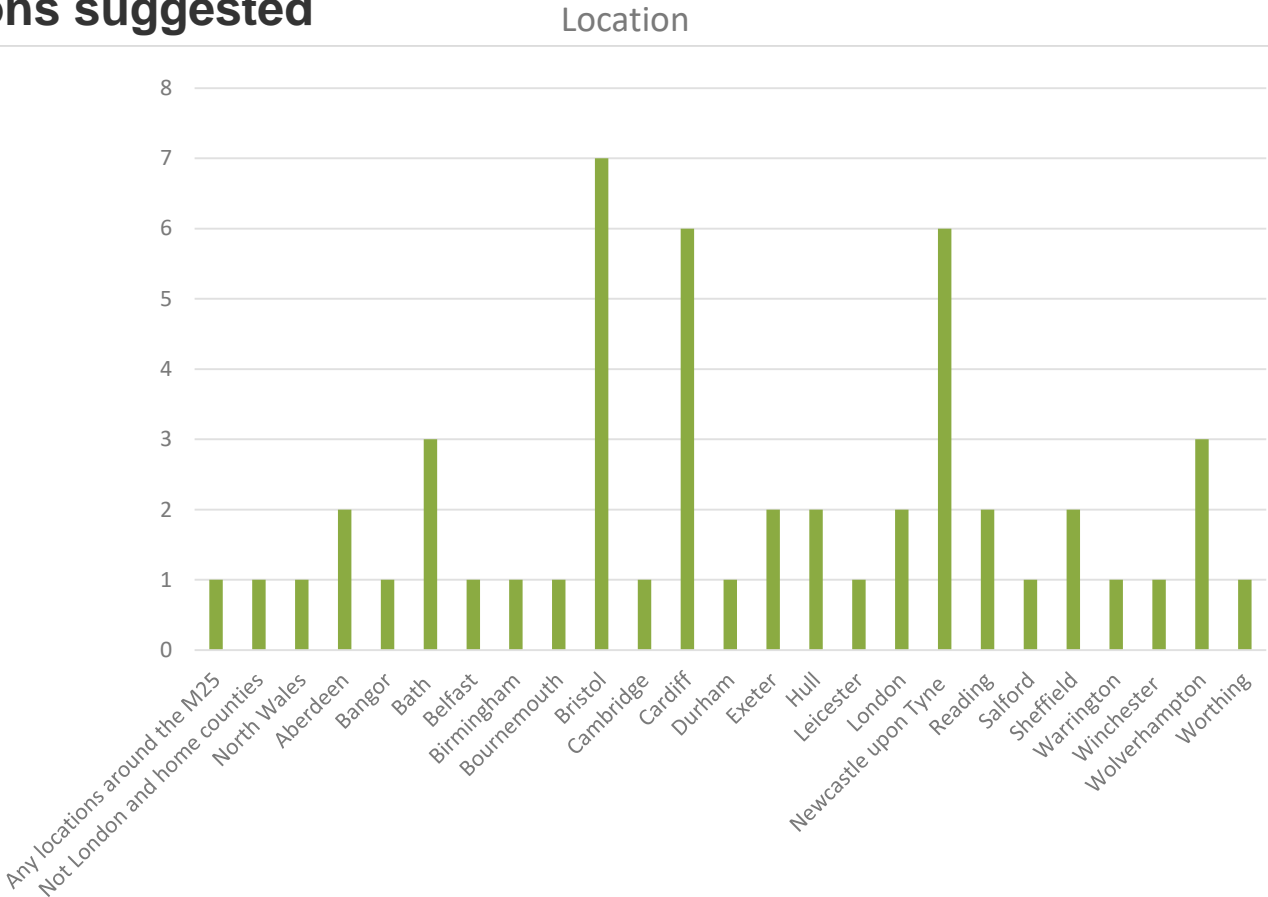
Outside of London, where would you prefer the conference to be?

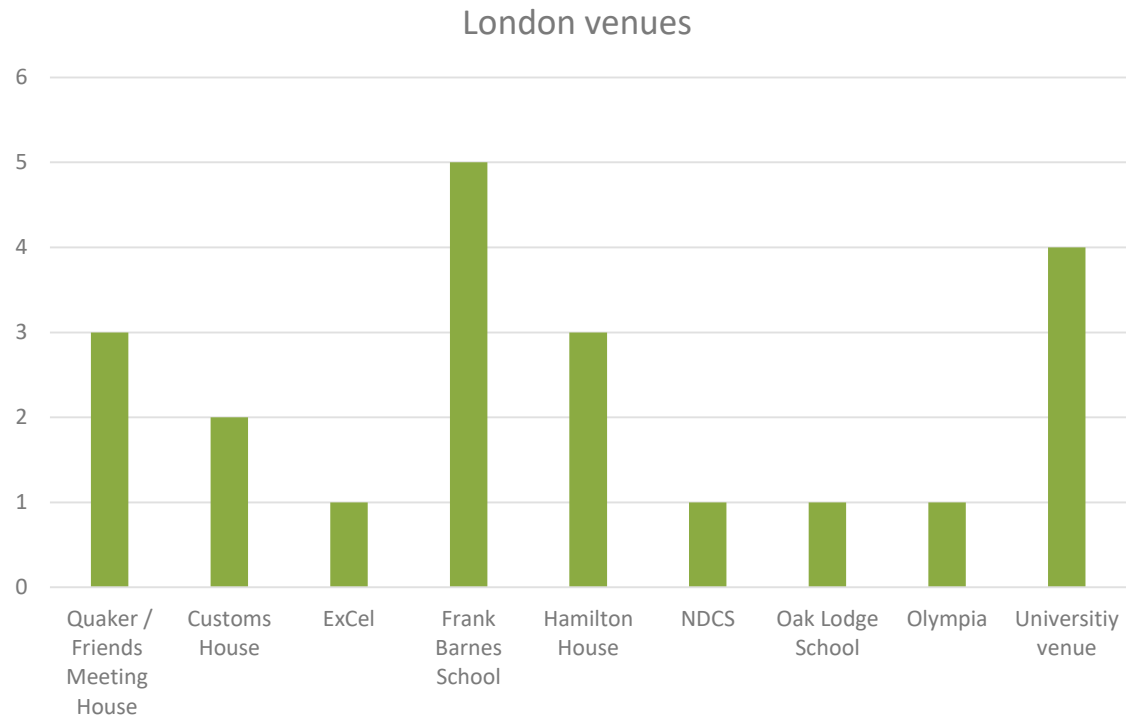

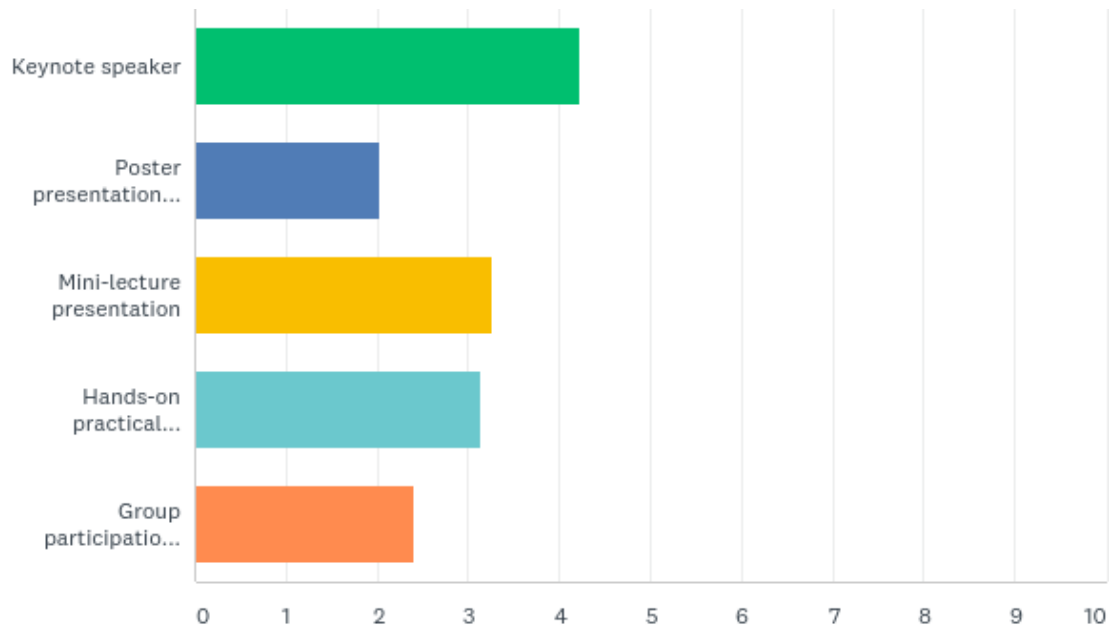

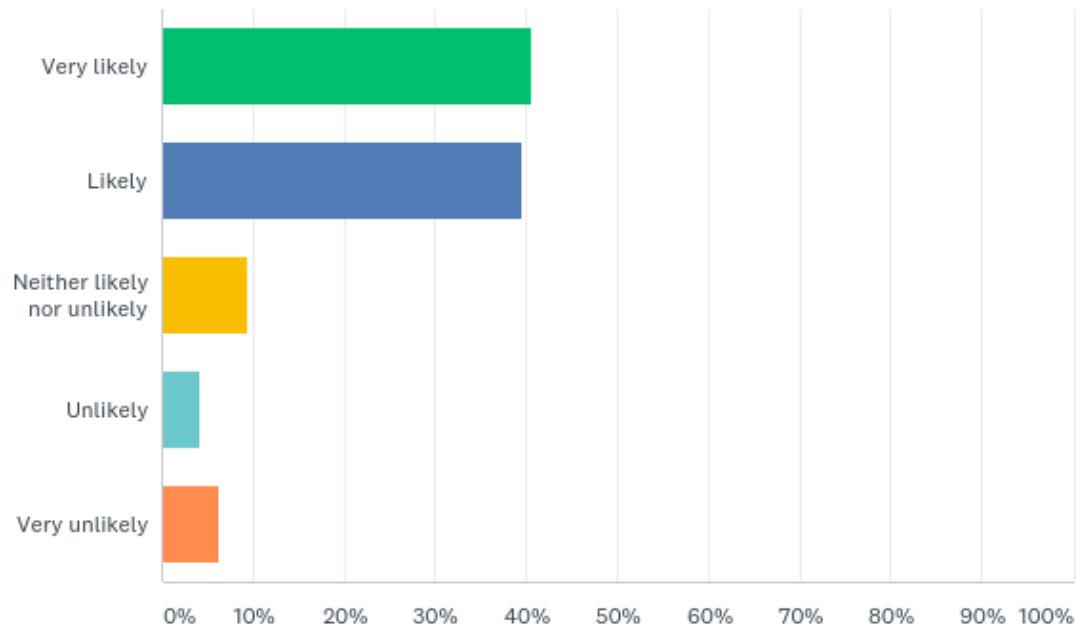


Is there another style of presentation your enjoy?



In addition to the annual conference, how likely are you to be interested in accessing recorded presentations online?

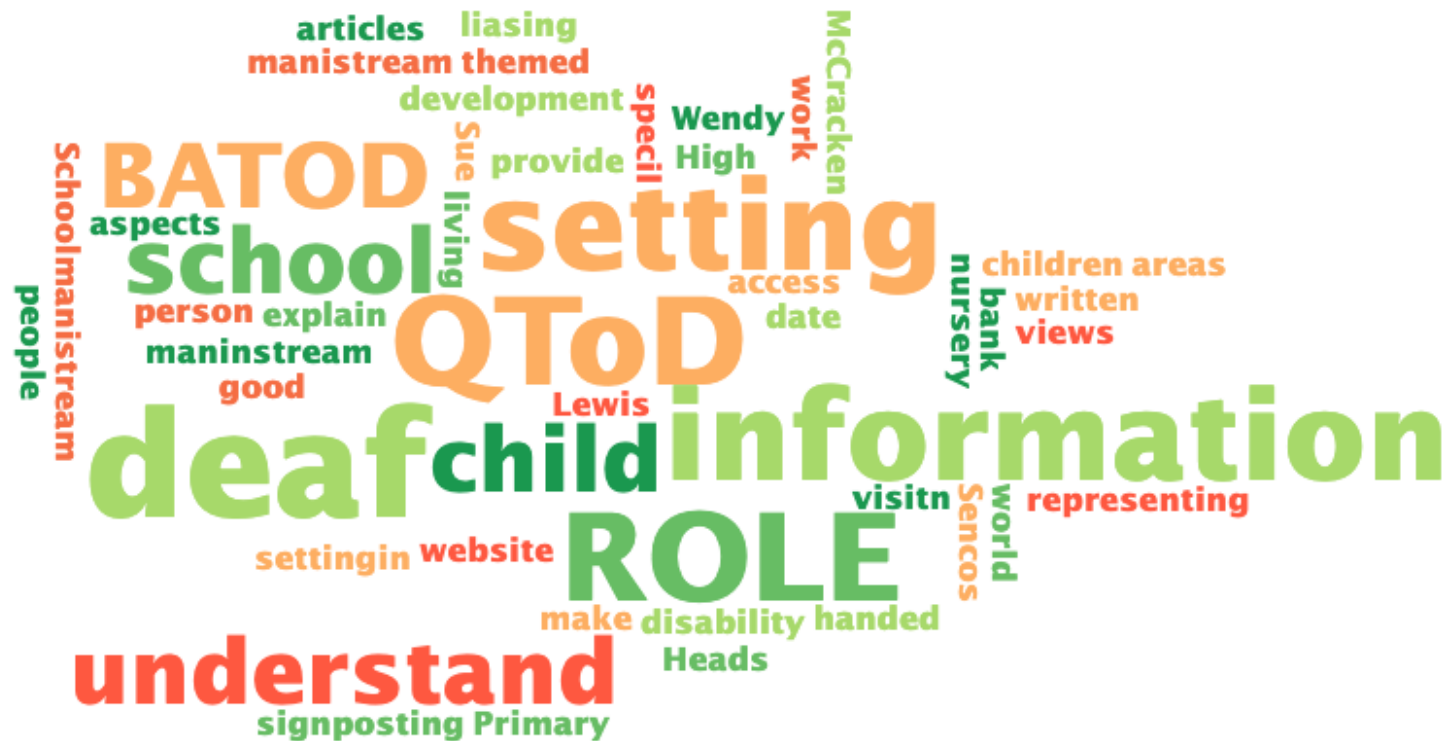

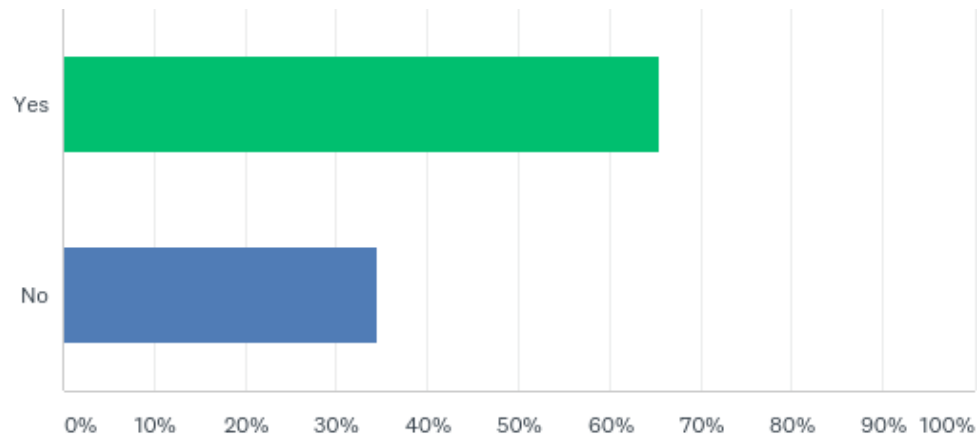

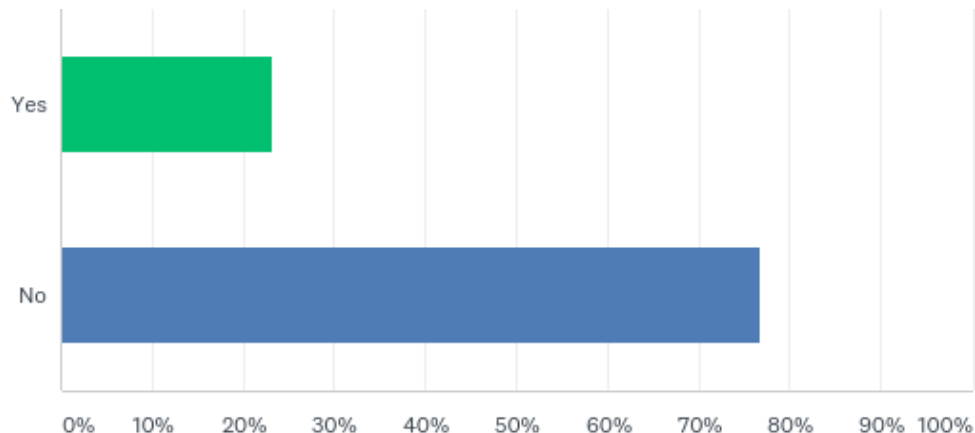
Do you like there to be a theme to BATOD conference?

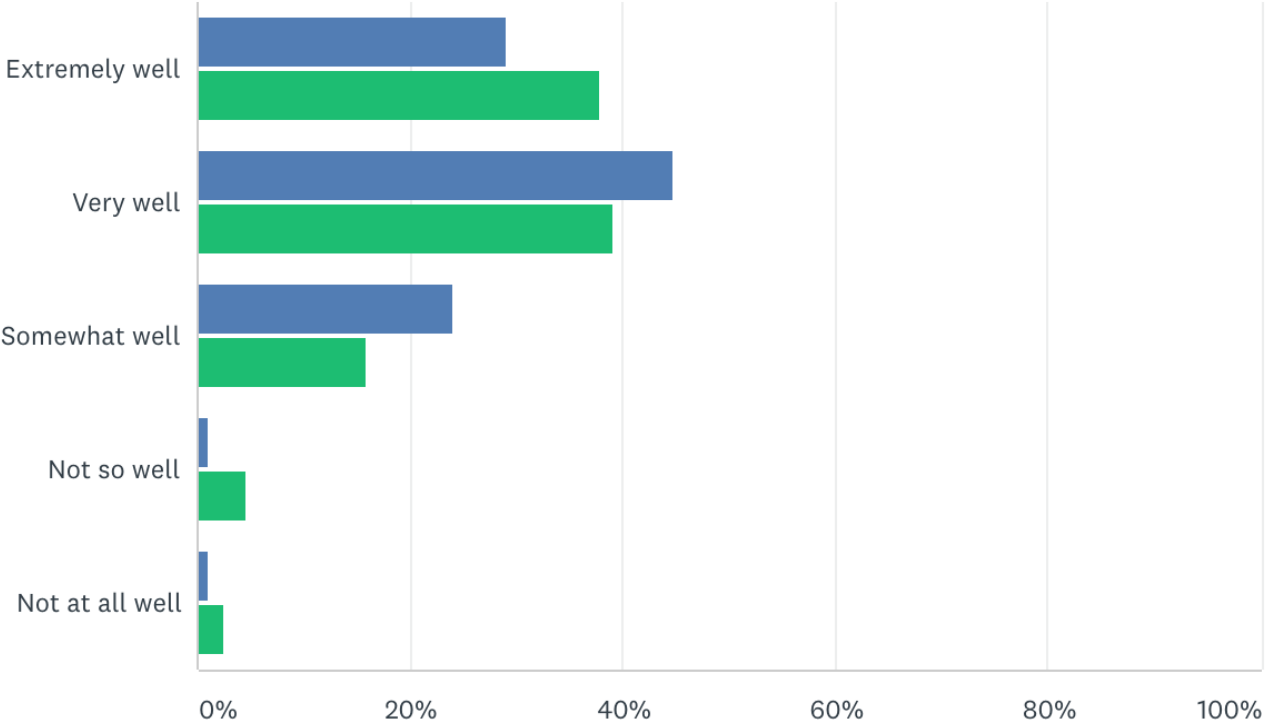


Were you aware that if you have a long distance or duration of travel you could apply for support through the Mary Grace Wilkins Travelling Scholarship?
