The school is run by a grassroots Ugandan organisation called the Organisation of Parents of Deaf Children and is the centre of their network of social care for vulnerable poor families who care for a child with disability.

Hearing loss is common in Uganda, due to ear infections, complications of measles and side effects from malaria treatments. Deaf children are often denied an education, and struggle to learn to talk or communicate in other ways, despite normal intelligence. Reading and writing skills can be very poor. This leads to long-term poverty, joblessness, and stigma. Research shows, early intervention with targeted education, nutritious food in a safe environment fundamentally alters a deaf Ugandan child's outlook for life.

Funds will be used to buy specialist teaching equipment and also a new disability safe kitchen, where the children can have learn to cook and be provided with regular meals.
