3: Where is my drink? Video

Previous learning.

- Це мій секретар. Tse miy sekretar.
- Це моя мама. Тѕе тоуа тата.
- Я не твоя менеджерка. Ya ne tvoya menedzherka.
- Я не твій дієтолог. Ya ne tviy diyetoloh.

Time to learn 4 words for drinks:

- Моя вода. Moya voda. My water.
- Моя кава. **Moya kava.** My coffee.
- Мій чай. **Miy chay.** My tea.
- Мій сік. **Miy sik.** My juice.

You can ask where your drink is, with the word for where: де? **De?** You can say please with будь ласка, **bud' laska**, and thank you with дякую, **dyakuyu**.

The reason it is **moya voda** but **miy chay**, is that water is a feminine noun and tea is a masculine noun. **Moya** and **miy** are "agreeing" with their noun. Another type of noun in Ukrainian is neuter, and examples are wine and beer ... 2 more drinks, and 1 more word for my:

- Де моє вино? **De moye vyno?** Where is my wine?
- Де моє пиво? De moye pyvo? Where is my beer?

Don't forget the words you have already learned: here is TyT ... tut!

You can ask another question with **tse**, the word for this is, just by making a questionning intonation.

- Це моє вино? Tse moye vyno?
- Це моє пиво? **Tse moye pivo?**

The words for your follow a similar pattern to the words for my, as this table shows. The words for your are when you is just one person, and the register is informal.

	Masculine	Feminine	Neuter
Му	Мій - miy	Моя - Моуа	Moε - moye
Your	Твій - Tviy	Твоя - Тvoya	Твоє - tvoye

We can make sentences negative with **ne**, the word for not: не. (It takes some adjustment for English speakers to see не and say **ne**, but you will get used to it!)

- Це не твоя кава. **Tse ne tvoya kava.** This is not your coffee.
- Це не твій сік. **Tse ne tviy sik.** This is not your juice.
- Це не твоє пиво? **Tse ne tvoye pivo?** Is this not your beer?
- Це не моя вода. **Tse ne moya voda.** It is not my water.
- Це не мій чай. **Tse ne miy chay**. It is not my tea.
- Це не моє вино? **Tse ne moye vino?** Is this not my wine?
