Nearly 70 regions around the world are participating in yarn bombing, a form of street art where yarn that is knit, crochet, or wrapped, adorns an object in a public space.

In its second year, yarn bombing is an awareness initiative of Deafblind International's (DbI) Communication Committee, also known as ComCom. June is a time when many around the world celebrate and raise awareness about deafblindness, as it is the birth month of Helen Keller. One of the most internationally recognized people with deafblindness.

By coming together to yarn bomb objects and community spaces in as many cities

and countries as possible, we strive to foster connections and unite a community with individuals, service and advocacy groups in the field, DbI members and partners, along with the wider global public.

The DbI Research Network is well into its 8th year of existence, and we continue to grow and expand. As of May 2022, we now have 183 members on our e-mail contact list.

Saskia Damen & Flemming Ask Larsen continue the maintenance of the Deafblind International Research Network Facebook Group, currently at 1,375 members and growing. Come look us up and join in the conversation! Walter Wittich continues to maintain our Deafblind International Research Network LinkedIn group, currently with 129 members.

The Action Research Working Group, led by **Susan Bruce** continues to promote collaborative opportunities, and you can learn more about her efforts on our Research Network web page. Additional initiatives are always welcome, so please get in touch with any of the members of the Dbl Research Network, in case you have an idea you would like to share.

Several members of the Dbl Research Network continue to collaborate on our team effort to create a Core Set for deafblindness, using the World Health Organization International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (WHO ICF) framework. Initiated by the leadership of Ricard Lopez, we have been able to recruit a 50+ member team to conduct a systematic literature review. You can learn more about the overall process through our open-access publication. Here we describe the overall project and its purpose in more detail.

Hello from the Nordic CHARGE network

We met in May in Iceland and part of the meeting we worked on our upcoming publication on CHARGE. It will be published by the Nordic Welfare Centre, who is the coordinator of the network. The publication will be in English and it will be followed by a webinar series. On our meeting we also planned the celebration of our 20th anniversary as a network. It will take place at the Nordic conference on Deafblindness in Tampere where we will do a network presentation. The network consists of members from Norway, Denmark, Iceland and Sweden. We collaborate with different national groups on CHARGE and with the international network.
